What is wisdom? – it is the sanctity of life expressed through justice.

Why do your parents say you are a smart and wise child?

- Because I listen to what they say & I obey their instructions.

How do you recognize that someone is wise?

- Because they share their possessions with others.

Why is it worth being wise? - Because we can respect others.

What can we do to become wise?

- To pay attention to what my parents and teachers and older people share with us.

How can we acquire wisdom?

- By listening smarter, listening to more experience people, by reading, by reflection and by choice of good not evil and by justice.

How should we be concerned into becoming a wise child, a wise student, a wise colleague, a wise son, and a wise daughter? By daily reflection on what I did right today.

Do I feel good about the right I did today? What I desire to correct in my life tomorrow?

How often do I

ask myself and ponder; - what would my mother and my father tell me to do?

Wisdom is gained by those who struggle with evil in their own conduct in everyday life.

Who is trying to be faithful to the commandments of the Lord and honouring to serve others with love. Those who teach justice will shine like stars... "Wisdom ... is above all, pure, ... agreeable, docile, obedient, full of mercy and good fruit." (Jacob 3: 17-18).

WISDOM - is a gift from The God, Holy Spirit, and a human virtue.

Wisdom is the sanctity of life expressed through justice. Wisdom leads people to immortal life and is

a priceless treasure. She plays great role in people's lives. The Book of Wisdom teaches that sin

blocks the way to wisdom. She is needed and "those who love her will see her easily, those who

seek her will find her." (Book of Wisdom 6:12). Wisdom "is an inexhaustible treasure for mankind;

those who won it, won the friendship of God, supported by gifts, which derive from discipline".

(Wisdom 7:14). And the Book of Ecclesiastes ends with a warning:

"Fear God and keep the commandments, for this is the whole duty of everyone."

(Ecclesiastes 12:13)

A wise person looks at life seriously, because wisdom protects against great mistakes. Wisdom benefits you in daily life. The words of the wise men can be sharp as spikes, but they provide some support in life, like nails or stakes that are firmly hammered to fasten the tent to the ground, or to restrict the movement of cattle in the pasture. And in the book of Job, God said to man: "The fear of God - wisdom indeed, and prudence - avoiding evil"(The Book of Job 28, 28).
